REQUEST OF THE UNITED STATES TO PARTICIPATE AT THE DECEMBER 6 HEARING Case No. 2:19-cv-05465-AB (AFMx)

On October 11, 2019, this Court set a hearing on December 6, 2019, for the motion to dismiss filed in this case by Writers Guild of America, West, Inc. and Writers Guild of America, East, Inc. (collectively, Writers Guild). On November 26, 2019, the United States filed a Statement of Interest pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 517. The United States now respectfully requests permission to participate at the December 6 hearing.

The United States seeks to participate at the December 6 hearing because it enforces the federal antitrust laws and has a significant interest in the proper application of the labor exemptions from the antitrust laws. In its Statement of Interest, the United States urged this Court to reject the Writers Guild's argument that the Court can apply the labor exemptions from the antitrust laws in this case on the pleadings. As the Statement explained, it is necessary for the Court to develop a factual record before deciding whether or not the labor exemptions apply, so that it can ensure that the fundamental national values protecting competition embodied in the federal antitrust laws are not displaced improperly.

The United States believes that its participation at the December 6 hearing would be of substantial assistance to the Court, and leaves it to the discretion of the Court to decide the form and extent of the United States' participation at the hearing. Counsel for the plaintiffs have informed the United States that they do not oppose the request. Counsel for the Writers Guild have informed the United States that they oppose the request.
